



First Presbyterian Church has a very rich history. Our start begins humbly in 1830 with 14 men and women willing to organize a church on the banks of the Chattahoochee River in a new town on the Georgia frontier.

As time passed, the church survived the Civil War only to be faced with a fire that left the structure in ruins in 1891. Instead of giving up hope, the members rallied together to rebuild the beautiful sanctuary so that future generations might have a place to worship. Before the ashes had cooled on the fire ravaged building, members came forth with their gifts to begin the process of rebuilding.

The **1830 Society** provides an opportunity to make an enduring statement of faith that will ensure excellence and strength for the ministries of First Presbyterian Church today, tomorrow and well into the future.


